

McDonald Is Mayflower Group Guest

Dr. James D. McDonald, outspoken critic of the Air Force for ringing Tucson with Titan missile bases, will be the speaker for the Mayflower

Society dinner at 1:30 p.m. Nov. 19 in the Arizona Inn.

About 25 to 30 descendants of passengers on the Mayflower on its voyage to Plymouth Rock in 1620 will attend the dinner. Those who have reason to believe they are descendants may attend as guests. John Fremont Anderson, captain of the society, is in charge of reservations.

The talk of Dr. McDonald, beginning about 2:30 p.m., is open to the public. He is a senior physicist in the University of Arizona Institute of Atmospheric Physics.
