

TAKING CASE TO CONGRESS

UA Physicist Seeks UFO Study

Dr. James E. McDonald, professor and senior physicist at the Institute of Atmospheric Physics of the University of Arizona, Monday will be one of six scientists to address the House Committee on Science and Astronautics in Washington, D.C.

He said today he will recommend support by the government for an extensive investigation by scientifically trained personnel of unidentified flying objects.

Last year, following more

than a year of concentrated study of dozens of UFO episodes, McDonald said he had come to the conclusion the most probable hypothesis to explain them is that UFOs are some sort of probe from outer space.

Last year, the Tucson scien-

tist also asked the United Nations to investigate UFOs, saying at the time: "Because of the current official, journalistic and scientific ridicule, there has been almost no scientific attention given to the problem."
